August 27, 2025 Title I Parents' Right-to-Know

Under Title I of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015, the Parents Right-to-Know provision requires that parents and guardians are informed of their right to ask for information about their child's teacher(s), including their training and credentials.

You may request the following information at any time:

- Whether the teacher met state qualifications and certification requirements for the grade level and subject he/she is teaching
- Whether the teacher received an emergency or conditional certificate through which state qualifications were waived
- What undergraduate or graduate degrees the teacher holds, including graduate certificates and additional degrees, and major(s) or area(s) of concentration
- Whether your child receives support from a paraprofessional. If they do, you may also ask about the paraprofessional's qualifications

Parents are encouraged to support their child's education and communicate with their child's teacher(s) on a regular basis.
